Usual Adult Dose for Skin and Structure Infection. Loading dose: 15 mg/kg IV once as a single dose. Maintenance dose: 7.5 mg/kg IV or orally every 6 hours. Maximum dose: 4 g/day. Usual duration of therapy: 7 to 10 days. Comments: -Most serious anaerobic infections are treated with IV therapy

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initially.

No drugs are approved for treatment of giardiasis in dogs and cats in the USA. Fenbendazole (50 mg/kg/day for 5–10 days) effectively removes Giardia cysts from the feces of dogs; no adverse effects are reported, and it is safe for pregnant and lactating animals. This dosage is approved to treat Giardia infections in dogs in Europe.

Fenbendazole is not approved in cats but may reduce clinical signs and cyst shedding at 50 mg/kg/day for 5 days.

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Metronidazole is the most commonly used antibiotic for giardia infection. Side effects may include nausea and a metallic taste in the mouth. Don't drink alcohol while taking this medication. Tinidazole (Tindamax). Tinidazole works as well as metronidazole and has many of the same side effects, but it can be given in a single dose. Nitazoxanide (Alinia).

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Commonly prescribed medications used to treat Giardia infection include tinidazole (Tindamax), nitazoxanide (Alinia) and metronidazole (Flagyl). A doctor should examine and consider treatment for sexual partners and people who have had close contact with the infected person, such as household

Antibiotic treatment is recommended for people who have tested positive for giardia, and for symptomatic contacts. Secondary lactose intolerance often occurs after giardiasis; patients with ongoing symptoms after treatment can consider temporarily avoiding lactose-containing foods (e.g. for one month).

Several drugs can be used to treat Giardia infection. Effective treatments include metronidazole, tinidazole, and nitazoxanide 1. Alternatives to these medications include paromomycin, quinacrine, and furazolidone 1, 2. Some of these drugs may not be routinely available in the United States.

If spore-forming rods, morphologically consistent with *Clostridium perfringens* are concurrently detected with *Giardia*, use of metronidazole is indicated as this drug is an antibiotic. If there is clinical evidence to suggest concurrent infection with a nematode, fenbendazole or febantel are indicated.

Treatment. Tinidazole, metronidazole, or nitazoxanide. Infected people who have symptoms can be treated with tinidazole, metronidazole, or nitazoxanide, taken by mouth.

Tinidazole, taken in a single dose, has fewer side effects than metronidazole, which is taken three times a day for 5 to 7 days.

The most common medication used to treat Giardia in dogs is Metronidazole (known as Flagyl) and it works well. If

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your pup's infestation doesn't respond to this, then there are other possible medications your vet can try, including Fenbendazole (Panacur).

Metronidazole (10-25 mg/kg BID 5-8 days) is the most commonly used extra-label therapy; however, efficacies as low as 50% to 60% are reported.

Albendazole is effective against Giardia but is not safe in dogs and should not be used. Fenbendazole (50 mg/kg SID for 3 to 5 days) is effective in eliminating Giardia infection in dogs.

Ronidazole is an anti-protozoal drug that is effective against Tritrichomonas foetus in the cat. Although the efficacy has been demonstrated in multiple studies, there is relatively little published information on this drug. Ronidazole is given orally for 14 days. It is compounded into capsules because,
